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EYFS

Reception class have been busy continuing our learning around the story Owl Babies. We thought of lots of adjectives to describe owls and learned some new vocabulary to help us with the descriptions. We have written about the story and used some of our new Tricky Words in our writing. We have been practising counting to 20 and beyond and really deepening our knowledge, working out missing numbers, ordering numbers to 20 and playing games to practise adding numbers within 20. Our class have really enjoyed playing and exploring the different resources that have been out since we came back from Easter break – it has been lovely to see the children interacting, problem solving and playing together.







Year 1

This week Year One have continued focussing on geography in our 'Many Worlds One Planet' theme. We learned what a compass is and how they are used. Then children worked in groups to use compasses accurately to complete some challenges. In English, we have been reading the story 'The Storm Whale In Winter'. The children planned their own retell of the story and they have worked hard with the first half of their writing.

Year 2

This week Year Two have been reading 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. They used this to then write a letter to the main character. Within Science, the children continued to learn about the needs of plants and talked about bulbs. The have also started to design a chair for baby bear to a given set of design criteria.

Year 3

This week Year three have honed their sketching and shading skills in art to complete their pencil sketches of African animals. They have really enjoyed doing them and have produced some really great pictures!







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Year 4

Year 4 have been learning all about persuasion and they are preparing to write letters of persuasion to MP's so that they save the rainforest. In Science they have been learning about electricity and making simple circuits.

Year 5

In Year Five we have been continuing our theme lessons with a DT focus. This week we have explored structures and in particular 'Truss bridges'. Children were given the challenge of creating a Truss bridge using spaghetti. They learned about the ways that triangles help to strengthen a structure. Despite some challenges in their building, they worked with accuracy which made some very strong bridges.



Year 6

This week in R.E. we have been learning about Peter the Apostle. We read a series of Bible quotes which helped us to form impressions of Peter as a person. We then discussed the highs and lows of his life and his relationship with Jesus before using 'hot seating' to interview Peter. This helped us to deepen our understanding of him. We also wrote a playscript based on Peter healing the lame man in front of the temple.
