

Sports Premium Funding Impact Report 2018-2019



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY- As a result of the Sport Premium funding we have increased the number of children attending after school clubs. This has been achieved by offering free after school clubs and increasing the variety and number of clubs on offer. We have also used the Sport Premium funding to overcome barriers in PE such as lack of public swimming, children not having access to a PE kit and cost implications. This has been achieved by subsidising the cost of swimming lessons as well as increasing the number of sessions for KS2 children, providing children with PE kits and offering transport to events. As well as offering access to traditional sports we have exposed children to other sports that they may not have had the opportunity to experience, for example a free archery after school club and a free sailing experience day.
